


### **Evaluation**

NOTE: There will be separate diagrams for the responses of project participants and non-participants. The left side diagram will demonstrate the answers of non-participants, and the right side diagram will demonstrate the answers of the project participants.

### 1. Assessment of the respondents' background

The total number of respondents was 156, 76 people were, and 80 weren't members of the project. 105 respondents were female, 45 were male, and 6 people preferred not to share their gender.





16 respondents were between 14-16 years old, 133 of them were between 16-22 years old, and there were also 7 respondents, who were above 22 years old.

As for political views, we gave the respondents five options. The results were the following:


Very liberal: 43 people


Slightly liberal: 42 people


2. <u>Assessment of the respondents' attitude and knowledge of</u> refugees and immigrants

Question 1: Which one is the correct term for refugee?

The respondents were given two options to choose from:

- Refugees are people who are fleeing from armed conflict or persecution and for whom denial of asylum has potentially deadly consequences. They leave their home countries because it is dangerous for them to stay. (correct)
- Refugees are people who are fleeing their countries for numerous reasons, for example, their homes have become dangerous or difficult to live in, or they could be fleeing from unrest, famine, drought or economic collapse. However, they are not in danger of conflict or persecution. (false)

116 people managed to choose the correct definition, and 40 chose the false one.



Question 2: What do you consider to be a determining factor that makes someone leave their homeland?

The respondents were given nine options to choose from. They were free to choose multiple answers. The most popular choices were:

War(s): 142 votes


Fatal or life-threatening reasons: 120 votes


• Economic reasons: 102 votes

Question 3: (a follow-up question to question 2) If you marked "fatal or life threatening reasons", which of the followings do you consider to be one of them?


The respondents were given nine options to choose from. They were free to choose multiple answers. The most popular choices were:

<u>Question 4:</u> Where do you get your information on recent news regarding refugees and current affairs?








Question 5: Do you know anyone in your community, who is a refugee?

83 people answered no, 69 people answered yes, and 4 people preferred not to say.







Question 6: (a follow-up question to question 5) If yes, please mark you experience with them according to the scale's marking.

Question 7: Have you ever experienced any negative impact on everyday life regarding refugees' integration process? 120 people answered no, and 36 people answered yes.




Question 8: (a follow-up question to question 7) If so, please provide some keywords.

145 people answered yes, 1 person answered no, and 10 people replied, that they were not sure.







Your friends: 81 votes












<u>Question 14:</u> Would you say that your country has made adequate initiatives to help the integration process of refugees in your country?












Question 18: In your opinion, do refugees play an important role in making a nation's culture more diverse?


